The following worksheet has been developed to complement the activities carried out at the Lifeskills Centre. However, it can easily be adapted to suit a wider range of abilities.

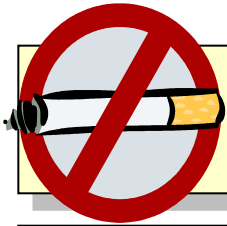
Below are some examples of other possible activities:-

- Increase an activity's level of difficulty by covering up the answers.

- Encourage the children to think about their answers by getting them to act out the scenarios described in the activity.



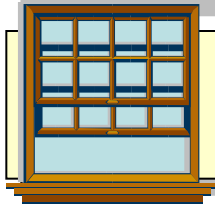
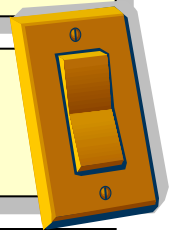
# Gas Safety

What would you do if you smelt gas and thought there might be a leak? Look at the information at the bottom of the page. Write each instruction next to the relevant picture to find out in which order they can safely be carried out.

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### Turn off the gas.

Check if any gas appliances have been turned on but have not been lit (e.g. a gas cooker or a gas fire). If not, turn off the gas at the meter.

### Don't touch electrical switches.

Turning a switch on or off gives a spark which may ignite the gas.

### Ring for help.

Call free on 0800 111 999.

### Open all the windows and doors.

Opening doors and windows lets the gas out and the fresh air in.

### Don't let anyone smoke or use a naked flame.

Any sort of flame could ignite the gas.
