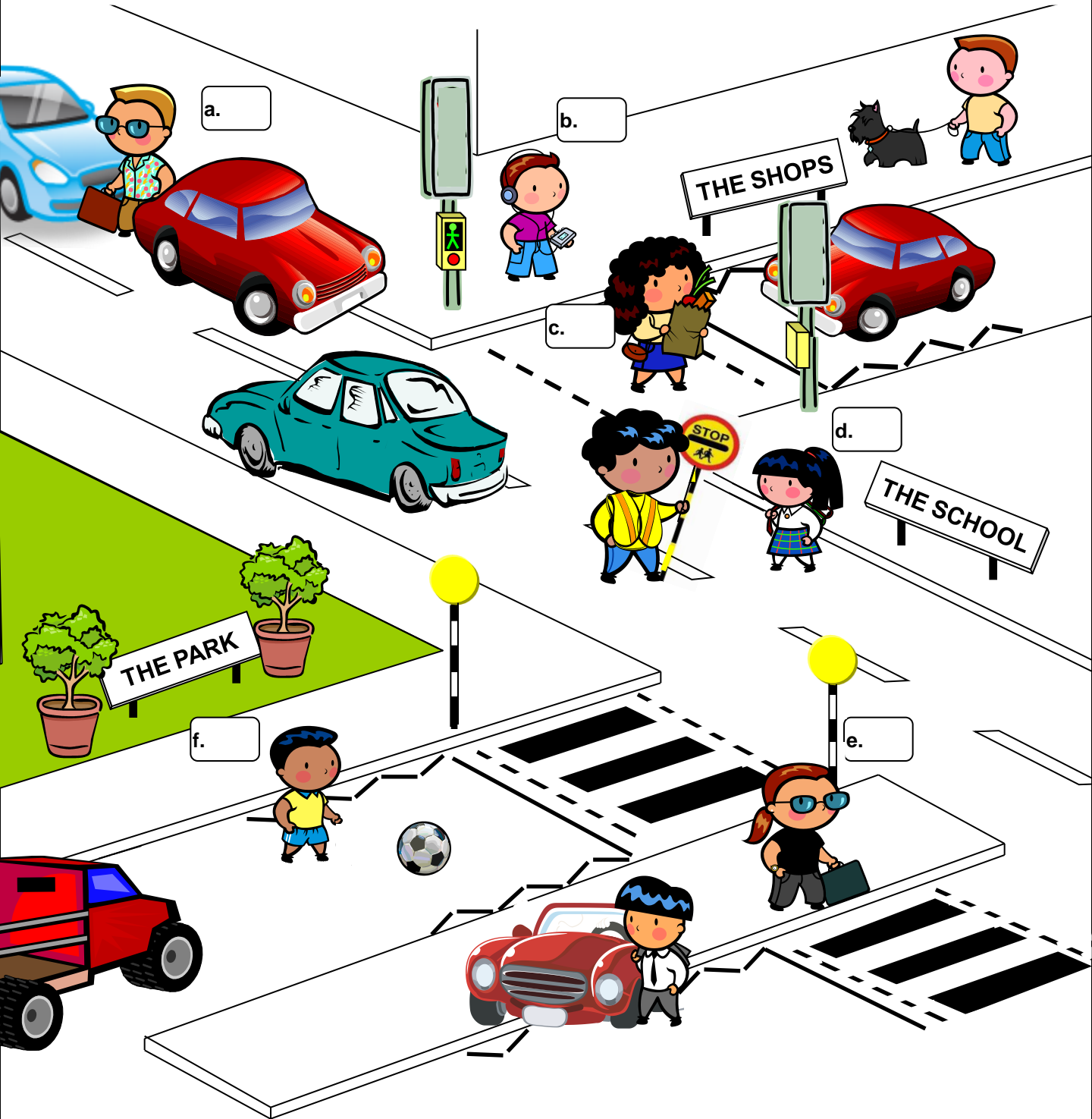
1. Look at the people below. Who do you think is crossing the road safely. Put a tick next to the people you think are safe and a cross next to the people who are not.

2. Can you spot someone who has parked illegally? Why is this wrong? _____

3. Draw a blue arrow to show the safest route from the school to the park.

4. Draw a red arrow to show the safest route from the school to the shops.

5. Draw a green arrow to show the safest route from the shops to the park.

Answers

1. Persons c, d and e are all crossing the road safely.
Person a is crossing between two cars which is not safe as he can't see the road properly.
Person b is listening to music and can't hear what is happening around him.
Person f has run out onto the road to get his ball without noticing that there is a car approaching.
2. The red car at the bottom of the page is parked on zigzag lines just before a zebra crossing. This is not allowed because it restricts the view of people crossing the road.
3. The safest route from the school to the park is via the school crossing patrol.
4. The safest route from the school to the shops is via the pelican crossing.
5. The safest route from the shops to the park is via the pelican crossing and then the school crossing patrol.
